

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

NEITHER DO I CONDEMN YOU

The Gospel on this Sunday presents us the famous encounter of Jesus with the woman who was to be stoned to death because of her alleged participation in the act of adultery. Because of his public acts and his manner of speaking Jesus was not very popular with the religious authorities; and because of this they sought to accuse him and eliminate him from public life. They saw the perfect opportunity when they brought forth this woman. They feigned their fidelity to the Law of Moses while using the woman to attack Jesus.

Jesus owned no home in Jerusalem and spent time with families and friends nearby the Mount of Olives. One day he was in the Temple area early in morning. A crowd also gathered there before the morning sun, to hear the teacher of Nazareth. On this particular occasion the scribes had prepared a trap for him.

According to the law, a woman caught in the act of adultery was to be stoned to death. They asked him concerning this law: and what do you say? It was a trap. Whatever his response would be, he would be accused one way or the other.
