### **JESUS IS THE LIBERATOR AND THE TEACHER**

The evangelist St. Luke tells the story of the inhabitants of Nazareth at the first preaching of Jesus in his own town: the Lord's neighbors react with violence and wanted to throw him over the side of hill.

From where does such a violence come, that could possibly lead to attempt to kill someone? Had Jesus offended a very good person, had he struck a powerful local in that town, had he acted against the interests of the people?

In fact, Jesus had spoken with authority, as a teacher every should listen to with attention, he had asserted that on that very day the Scriptures had been fulfilled. With these words, he had declared that he was the Savior, the one who would free the imprisoned, would heal the sick, would raise the poor out of their lowliness.

The Nazarenes rebel against these actions of divine power and attempt to quiet Jesus by attacking his family origins, denying him the claim that he was teacher and savior. The inhabitants of Nazareth were expecting the public exercise of great miracles and signs, indisputable proof that he was the actual Messiah.
