### **CHRIS KING OF THE UNIVERSE**

It is the feast of Christ the King. This is the Sunday that brings to an end the Liturgical Year of our faith. Christ is the Alfa and the Omega, that is, the beginning and the end, or better yet, the fulfillment of all good things.

Christ is the King of the universe and the King of all who confess that He is our Savior. Christ is the one who conquers us by giving himself completely on the altar of the cross, dying for us. My king delivers me from all form of slavery, and more, he wants me to live a completely full life. My king allows me to establish a strong and loving relationship with Him; he is always ready to intercede for us and ready to be our strength and energy in his Word, in his Eucharist, in the Holy Spirit, in Mary, in our neighbor and in and for the poor.

The Gospel today tells us of Jesus in the presence of Pontius Pilate. He is about to be condemned and crucified. Nevertheless, at the very moment, horribly fragil from the severest wounds at the hands of soldiers, says: "I am King. My kingdom is not of this world. It was born and came to this world: to give witness to the truth. All who are of the truth listen to my voice." Jesus gives personal testimony of this truth as the King who saves, with humility, with love, without uttering a single falsehood.
